THE BENEFITS OF REGISTRATION

Under new EU legislation all horses must have a DEFRA approved passport by 30 June 2004. Any horse, provided their adult height exceeds 148cms (14.2hh approx), can be adequately identified on application and issued with a DEFRA approved passport. All SHB(GB) passports also allow horses to compete in Affiliated Showing and Sport Horse Classes run under SHB(GB) rules. Horses competing in Ridden Qualifying Classes must also be on the annual Show Hunter Register.

The Stud Books are designed to give a structure to the future of British breeding. It is also increasingly likely that in the future competitive events will be restricted to horses with breeding documents. Mares of unknown breeding can come forward for Grading and if successful be issued with a Foundation Stud Book passport. This is the first rung on the ladder for these mares and eventually the produce of these mares will have built up an authenticated pedigree in the same way as the mares in the Main and Head Stud Book, so that over a period of time the breeding of all horses will be fully documented. This will allow the identification of successful bloodlines to enable a more scientific and selective approach to breeding programmes. All the horses entering the Stud Books have to submit a sample for a DNA Profile, each individual's profile is unique and permanent. This makes the DNA profile a powerful method of identification, which can act as a deterrent against theft and easily resolve cases of disputed identity. Importantly, it also ensures that the parentage of all foals can be confirmed.

The progeny of graded mares entered in any of the Stud Books by SHB(GB) graded stallions will be entitled to Full SHB(GB) breeding papers (not just identity papers) and those horses with just one graded parent will be eligible for Auxiliary breeding papers. PLEASE NOTE: If the sire is not an SHB(GB) Graded Stallion, he must be registered as a breeding stallion with another Official Breed Society. SHB(GB) is a full member of the World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses. All successful competition horses with SHB(GB) breeding papers qualify to go on to the WBFSH World Rankings and their breeders will be eligible for the prizes which the WBFSH awards annually. Britain has been producing top sport horses for many years but until recently the Society has been unable to emphasise the outstanding national and international influence that our stallions have had, particularly in the eventing world. As members of the WBFSH, SHB(GB) bred competition horses are now gaining the international recognition they deserve which has allowed Great Britain to take its rightful place in the world rankings.

The schemes that the Society has put in place should raise the profile of the British bred horse both at home and abroad and give British breeders some of the opportunities available to their European counterparts. All SHB(GB) registration and identity documents are acceptable for export purposes. It is hoped that those horses in possession of Stud Book papers with authenticated pedigrees and eligibility for the WBFSH will prove to be in demand and that this will stimulate a more active market place for British bred horses. If higher prices can be generated for stock this will have a knock on effect throughout the industry as a whole and hopefully be of benefit to all our members.

THE DATA PROTECTION ACT 1998 NOTICE

GENERAL

Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (“SHB(GB)”) is a data controller registered with the Information Commissioner and endeavours at all times to process your personal data in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. Your personal details will be kept confidential and secure and, as part of your membership contract, will be processed by SHB(GB) for the following purposes:

- Administration of your membership of SHB(GB) (see overleaf).
- Contacting you about SHB(GB)’s activities.
- Statistical and analytical purposes.
- Supplying information to the National Equine Database (“NED”) (see above).

SHB(GB) will not disclose your personal data to third party data controllers other than in connection with the NED (see below), unless in accordance with law or with your permission.

SHB(GB) will continue to process your personal data as part of its ongoing horse breeding database, until you notify SHB(GB) to stop processing your personal data.

NATIONAL EQUINE DATABASE

Information supplied in connection with your membership application or horse registration will be passed by SHB(GB) to National Equine Database Society Ltd (“NEDSoc”), which was established by DEFRA in collaboration with representative bodies of the GB equine industry and which runs the National Equine Database (“NED”). A list of those representative bodies is available from DEFRA at 1A Page Street, London, SW1P 4PQ (Zootechnics Branch, Rabies and Equine Division) or from SHB(GB).

Horse passport information about horse and owner is being collected by NEDSoc in order to provide a source of data that supports veterinary disease control and surveillance activities. The information will also be used by DEFRA:

- to discharge its responsibilities for implementation of horse passports;
- to facilitate strategic planning within the equine sector;
- to assist in tracing the owners of straying, lost or stolen horses; and
- to reduce malpractice in the sale of horses and ponies.

The information passed to NEDSoc will also provide a central, archived sources of Breeding, Evaluation and Performance (“BEP”) data, which will enhance the quality of horses bred in Great Britain. BEP data will be accessible by third parties for a fee online, but the accessible data will not include your personal data. Any inquiries from users of the website will be directed to the organisation or society that forwarded the data to the NEDSoc.

The horse passport based information may, in future, be used for research purposes or statistical analysis by educational and commercial organisations. Your personal data may be shared, if necessary, within the DEFRA family, with other Central Government Departments and with Non-Departmental Public Bodies and with Local Authorities. They are required by law to keep your personal data confidential and secure at all times. Data may be processed by a contracted third party on their behalf: that party will also be required to keep all data secure.

In certain, limited circumstances, NEDSoc or its agents may be required to release information, including personal data, on request under the Environmental Information Regulations, the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information or the Freedom of Information Act 2000. However, neither NEDSoc nor its agents will permit any unwarranted breach of confidentiality nor will SHB(GB) act in contravention of its obligations under the Data Protection Act 1998.

Unless you indicate otherwise to NEDSoc at the address above, DEFRA or its appointed agents may use the name, address and other details on your application form to contact you in connection with occasional customer research, aimed at improving the services that it provides.

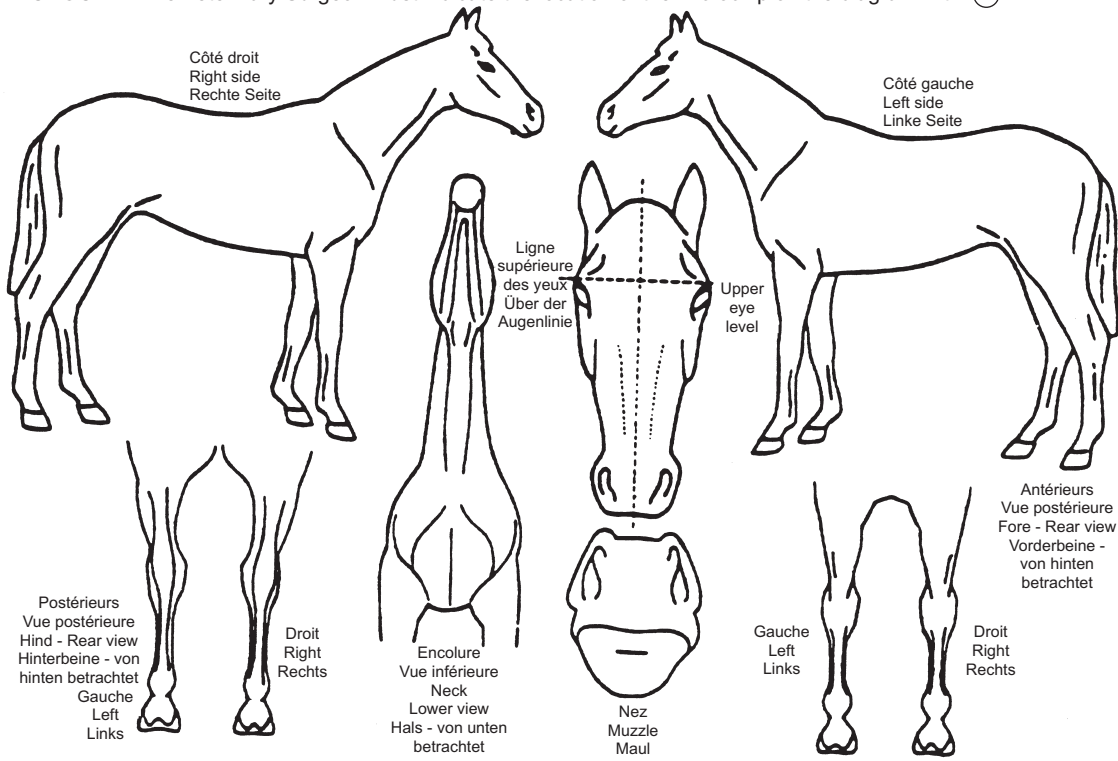
IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURE

The recommended procedure for identification is described in the F.E.I. booklet 'Identification of Horses'.

The diagram and written description must agree and must be sufficiently detailed to ensure the positive identification of the animal in future. White markings must be shown in red and the written description completed using black ink in block capitals or typescript. If there are no markings, this fact must be stated in the written description.

All head and neck whorls should be marked ("X") and described in detail. Other whorls should be similarly recorded in greys and in animals lacking sufficient other distinguishing marks. Acquired marks ("V") and other distinguishing marks, e.g. prophet's thumb mark ("+"), wall eye, etc., should always be noted.

MICROCHIP: The Veterinary Surgeon must indicate the location of the microchip on the diagram with 'm'.
